

SWIMMING

Seen Sachau, Ryan Clark and Lindsay Larson led the way for the Clarenceville Swim Club at the annual County Game Splash, hosted by the Coaches on Dec. 5-6 at Clarenceville High. Sachau took four firsts in the Boys 8 and under class. He swept the 25, 50, and 100-yard freestyle in 21.65, 46.96 and 1:46.87, respectively. Sachau also won the B Division 25 butterfly (2:42.43) and took second in the 25 backstroke (2:52.52). He also added a second in the 25 breaststroke (2:30.30). Clark, competing in the Boys 11-12 age category, took first in the A Division 100 freestyle (1:53.83) and B Division 50 backstroke (3:36.3). Other Clark places included a third in the 50 butterfly (4:07.17); fourth in the 50 freestyle (1:21.29) and 100 backstroke (1:20.44); sixth, 100 individual medley (2:10.45); and eighth, 100 breaststroke (1:32.03) — all B Division events. Larson, competing in the Girls 8 and under category (B), won the 25 backstroke (2:31.31) and 50 freestyle (33.52). She also took second in the 100 freestyle (1:30.72) and 100 IM (1:48.55); and third in the 25 breaststroke (2:53.05). In Girls 10 and under, Jessica Makowski achieved a state time in the 100 backstroke (1:21.30) and 50 breaststroke (45.26), both firsts. Justin Marshall (Boys 11-12) achieved a state time by winning the AA 100 IM (1:15.4). He also captured

the A Division 100 backstroke (1:16.00). Michigan's Parth (Boys 11-12) added firsts to the 100 breaststroke (A, 30.17) and (B) 50 freestyle in (A, 30.37). Parth also took second in the 100 IM (1:15.53) and 50 breaststroke (40.22), both B events. Matt Egbers (Boys 9-10) won the AA 50 freestyle (32.77) and took second in the 100 IM (1:24.64). He also finished third in the B Division 100 freestyle (1:16.55) and 50 butterfly (41.58); fifth, 50 backstroke (44.41) and 100 backstroke (1:35.02). Joey Bulbitz (Boys 9-10) contributed firsts in the A Division 100 backstroke (1:26.49) and B Division 100 freestyle (1:15.85). Bulbitz also took a second in the A Division 50 freestyle (32.76) and B Division 50 butterfly (41.05). He also took seventh in the (B) 100 IM (1:29.58). The lead changed hands six times in the third quarter, but once the Yellowjackets seized it in the fourth, they never gave it up. A basket by junior Calvin Pruitt put the Hawks up by a basket, 55-50, with 4:03 left. But the Yellowjackets answered with a 3-pointer from junior guard Damon Gunn, which triggered a game-tying 11-4 run. Despite five turnovers, an intentional foul and three missed free throws, Harrison still had a shot in the game in the closing seconds. Trailing 58-55 with less than 30 seconds left, the Hawks worked the ball to their top gun, senior Ryan Cahill. Cahill led the Hawks with 14 points, hitting three triples, all in the first half. By the time he got the ball, he was deep in the corner and smothered in Yellowjackets. His throw missed everything. Jeremy Teachman scored 11 points and Keye Smith added 10 for the Hawks. "This was predictable," Teachman said of the 0-4 start. "We weren't expecting to lose to Kettering, but we knew this had a chance of happening. Hopefully,

we will grow from this and be better for it once the conference season begins." Winning, as Keener will tell you, is a learned behavior. Farmington High outscored Birmingham Seaholm 5-4 in overtime Thursday to win a non-league boys basketball game, 55-54, at Seaholm. Both teams are 2-2 overall. Jason Jackson was a hero at the end of regulation and in OT for the Falcons. Jackson's jump shot with 23 seconds left in the fourth quarter forced OT tied at 50-50. Jackson also hit the winning shot from the lane with :13 left in OT. Seaholm scored the first four points of OT but Farmington's Brian Farr made a jump shot and Matt April split a pair of free throws to pull the Falcons within 54-53 to set up Jackson's winning basket. Farmington played without leading scorer Stanley Lewis, who was benched because of disciplinary reasons, and it showed as the Falcons trailed 31-28 at halftime and by as much as 13 in the third quarter. Seaholm led 45-39 after three

quarters but Farmington outscored the Maples 11-5 in the fourth quarter.
