Schoolcraft College's men's basketball team, short on numbers (only seven players left) and victories (none since November), lost at least one player to academic woes at the January semester break.

Bryant Markowicz, a 6-7 froshman from Doarborn Crestwood, did not make the necessary grades to remain eligible.

Also, freshman Courtney Williamsonbey, the Occlota' 6-5 starting power forward, was—as coach Dave Bogataj described it—"on the bubble." Williamsonbey has a grade pending that, if it goes through as it is, will sideline him for the rest of the season, too.

Injuries and defections have already cost SC six players, putting a severe strain on the Occlot bench.

Going into last Saturday's game against Alpena CC, SC had lost seven consecutive games and was 0-4 in Eastern Conference play.




