partment of Corrections, said informing other jurisdictions where a prisoner has an outstanding warrant or has violated probation, as in Scarborough's case, is standard procedure.

"That is what we'll do," he said.

Texas will file a detainer, or order to hold the prisoner, when he
is close to release, and then will
review the case, Guerra said.
"It's done on a case by case basis," he said.
Scarborough, 32, pleaded guilty
to the charges on Jan. 6. He will
be sentenced on Jan. 29 in Oakland County. Circuit Court in
Pontiac.

The victim worked at Cellular

One on Northwestern Highway in Farmington Hills where the attack took place Sept. 16, 1991. She had gone to the rest room at about 7:50 p.m. when Scarborough, who worked as a janitor for a maintenance company, followed her and attacked her. She testified that as she was washing her hands, Scarborough came up from behind and began choking her.

The woman told police she nearly passed out twice and was thrown to the floor. She struggled with Scarborough as he pulled a knife, held it to her neck and cut her before fleeing.

"She was lucky," said Farming-ton Hills Police Detective Brian DeGrande. "This was the same

kind of attack, a murder-rape, as the one in Texas."

Scarborough had been living in Detroit for two years after returning to Michigan, Hills police said. Oakland County Assistant Prosecutor Randy Secontine said he was ready to try the case, and that may have been a factor in Scarborough's plea.

"We would have gone to trial," he said. "Our proofs were very strong and we had witnesses ready to testify. It think experience shows that trying the case is more likely to produce a stiffer sentence (for a guilty verdict)."

Cornelius Pitts, Scarborough's attorney, could not be reached for comment.


