Bank robbers sentenced to prison

"Two Novi men were sentenced for an armed robbery of a Michi-gan National Bank branch in Farmington Hills leat July.

Oakland Circuit Court Judge Oakland Circuit Court Judge Jessica Cooper sentenced Robert Andrew Wikaryasz, 22, to 5-30 years in prison for armed robbery and conspiracy to commit armed robbery. A charge of using a fire-arm in the commission of a felony

was dropped.

His brother Jason James
Wikaryasz, 23, was sentenced to
two years for armed robbery and
two years for using a firearm in
the commission of a felony.

The brothers each received credit for 189 days served and will have to pay restitution of \$1,116.
