'Yes, sir!'

County boot camp expands as state's falters

Oakland County is expanding its boot camp even as the state's program is coming under fire as expensive and ineffective.

After two years of operating a seasonal boot camp, the Oakland County sheriff's department opened its first winter seasion—with nonviolent male offenders braving subfreezing temperatures in tents.

"The boss (Sheriff John F. Nichols) went through the winter in tents during World Wer II," said Carl G. Matheny, a major in the sheriff's department. "We figure immates can survive too."

Thirty-seven defendants started the county's first winter season boot camp in the week of Jan. 10. As of Friday, 23 were still enrolled.

Oakland experimented with a boot camp in the fall of 1990 be-fore offering it on a permanent ba-

sis in each of the next two years. Until now it was a seasonal pro-gram, generally from April into the fall.

Turns offenders around Nichols, for whom the camp is named and possibly its staun-chest supporter, insists the boot named and possibly its staunchest supporter, insists the boot
camp turns young offenders
around by offering a highly disciplined lifestyle in a quasi-military setting, it's also cheaper than
housing defendants in the already
crowded jail.

Preliminary figures seem to
support that theory.

Of 259 inmates to go through
boot camp, 21 have been accused
of additional crimes, according to
figures released last week by Ann
Russell, a civilian corrections
staff sesistant.

Russell didn't have precise figures on the per day costs of keeping an inmate in boot camp. "But
it costs \$60 a day to keep an inmate in the regular jail. If we can
keep an inmate in boot camp for
icas, the program is very cost effective."

In sharp contrast, the state's
boot camp program is running in

the red with no indication it helps deter criminal activity, according to a report released earlier this month by the Senate Fiscal Agen-

The report said the 90-day boot camp costs nearly \$10,500 per participant — more than double the amount needed to imprison other nonviolent offenders — with

other nonviolent offenders — with no sign its graduates are less like-ly to commit other crimes. Michigan has operated its boot camp program for five years dur-ing which time it processed about 4,000 immates.

ing which time it processed about 4,000 inmates.
"I think there are big differences between the state's program and ours," said Matheny. "I think we are more selective . . . and more successful."

Schooling included

Matheny, who has studied the state's program, said Oakland gets young offenders before they have committed to a life of crime. "We work them hard and give them some schooling." County commissioner Marilynn E. Gosling, R. Bloomfield Hills, said she has voted for the boot camp because of its apparent suc-


cess. "It's a rough and tumble program," she said. "Inmates learn what It's like to say, Yes, air." "However, operating the camp is becoming more and more expensive, she said, something that prompts her to take a closer look at the program. "But it's hard to put a price tag on turning somebody's life around."

Circuit Judge Edward Soanick asid he is a strong supporter of he boot camp. "Some of these young people (usually in their 20s) have never had discipline in their lives. The boot camp helps instill discipline, self esteem and self reliance. It's a better use of their time than having them sit around a jail cell."

To qualify for boot camp, an in-mate must be in good shape and pass a physical exam. By choos-ing boot camp— and successfully completing the program— in-mates can take months off their regular sentence, he said.

Matheny said he considers the program to be so successful, he can envision something compara-ble for women offenders.
