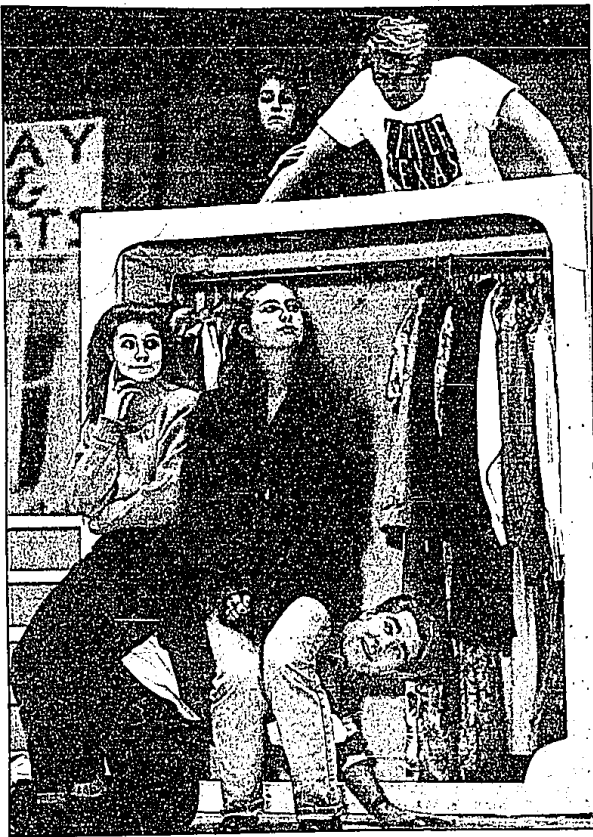


'Hello, Dolly'

lamb-baking service (half or whole lambs).

The Mitrikeski family arrived in the U.S. in July of 1989 to visit some educators in Atlanta and neighboring communities, and they ended up settling in Wayne County.

In 1990, Drasko worked as a short-order chef at the Alexander The Great restaurant, on Warren east of Wayne Road in Westland, and in 1991 took a job at Crystal

Bakery in Canton. He followed that with another job at the Modern Bakery in Oak Park while Sonja went back to school to study writing at Oakland Community College.

In the meantime, Ljupka Mitrikeski took a job as a babysitter and as a companion for senior citizens.

The Mitrikeski family remembered that the fervent dream of Ljupka's husband, Radomir, was

to have a bakery of their own. Having worked with his father in Skopje, Yugoslavia, Drasko knew all of his father's recipes for specialty baked goods.

"The secret ingredient of making the best pastries in the world is love," said Sonja. Together they bought the Farmington Bakery in February of last year, and since have successfully presented their baked goods to the public.
