Ex-resident charged in fraud case

A former Farmington Hills resident was arraigned Jan. 14 on charges of bank fraud, forging securities (checks), mail fraud, interstate transportation of fraudulently obtained money, false use of a Social Security number and making a false application for a passport.

U.S. attorney Stephen J. Markman said Grace Ann Davey, 53, a citizen of Canada, was charged in

U.S. District Court before U.S. Magistrate Judge Paul J. Komives.

She was charged under the name Lola Jean Preston, a name she acquired after assuming the identity of a deceased child (Lola Jean Wilhelm) and then marrying David Raymond Preston, federal authorities said. ne acquired after assuming the dentity of a deceased child (Lola an Wilhelm) and then marrying lavid Raymond Preston, federal uthorities said.

Markman said Davey and David Parkman Said Parkman S

vid Preston were charged in an 85-count indictment filed in Fobruary of 1992. The charges include defrauding Michigan National Bank of approximately \$1 million over a two-year period and using the money for personal expenses.

Davey was taken into custody in Winnipeg, Manitoba, on Sept. 8, 1992, where she was living un-der the name Dawne Hendrick-son. She waived an extradition

Davey faces up to 30 years in prison and a fine of \$1 million ff convicted of the bank fraud charges. The other charges carry lesser penalties.


