Ex-resident charged in fraud case

A former Farmington Hills resident was arraigned Jan. 14 on charges of bank fraud, forging securities (checks), mail fraud, interstate transportation of fraudulently obtained money, false use of a Social Security number and making a false application for a passport.

She was charged under the name Lola Jean Preston, a name she acquired after assuming the identity of a deceased child (Lola Jean Wilhelm) and then marrying David Raymond Preston, federal authorities said.

vid Preston was charged in an 85-count indictment filed in February of 1992. The charges include defrauding Michigan National Bank of approximately \$1 million over a two-year period and using the money for personal expenses.

Preston turned himself in in July of 1992 and pleaded guilty to helping Davey avoid capture by the FBI.

Davey was taken into custody in Winnipeg, Manitoba, on Sept. 8, 1992, where she was living under the name Dawne Hendrickson. She waived an extradition hearing.

Davey faces up to 30 years in prison and a fine of \$1 million if convicted of the bank fraud charges. The other charges carry lesser penalties.
