A civilian employee in the Oakland County Sheriff's Department
pleaded not guilty Saturday when
arraigned on embezzlement
charges stemming from the diseppearance of as much as \$80,000.
Terry A. Malera, who has
worked at the department since
the mid 1980s, is accused of taking the money over a period of
vears.

Malers, 32, of Vassar was re-mended to the Oakland County jail after failing to post \$75,000

bond.

The shortage was discovered last weck when en attorney, attempting to execute a court order, attempted to force the return of \$35,000 seized by law enforcement agencies from a client. That money, and more, was missing from a safe to which only a few people had access.
