Theater Workshop Is Planned

A workshop in theater for high school students will be offered at Eastern Michigan University this summer.

It is scheduled for Aug. 1 through 14. Applications may be obtained by writing to Conference Coordinator, Division of Field Services, Eastern Michigan University, Ypsilanti, 48197.

The workshop will include rehearsals and performances and classes in stage movement, vocal techniques, play production and technical theatre. It will be taught by M. R. McElya, assistant professor of speech and dramatic arts.

Students will live in Eastern's residence halls where all meals will be cafeteria style. A fee of \$117 covers room, board and tuition. A \$15 deposit must be paid with the application by July 5 and the balance by July 19.

Two hours of graduate credit may be earned by teachers and prospective teachers of dramatic arts in secondary schools.
