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Republicans to select local chair

Just when you thought it was safe to pick up the paper and not see another election story, the 11th Congressional District Republicans will elect a chairman Friday night at the state Republican convention.

The contestants are only two in number, Farmington resident Patrick Anderson and Judy Riedlinger, the former 18th District chair and Bloomfield Township resident. Harry Greenleaf of Livonia was a candidate until recently, but pulled out and threw his support to Riedlinger.

"The interest in this race is intense," Anderson said. "There are no vacancies at all in the 11th District delegation to the Republican State Convention. This is greater interest than we saw in the campaign last year for the Republican national committeewoman election."

Anderson, 33, has picked up endorsements from his boss, Richard Headlee (the owner of Alexander Hamilton Insurance Company), state Sen. Dave Honigman, R-West Bloomfield, and state

"The support of Honigman, Headlee and Jamian shows a groundswell of support from all different parts of the Republican party," Anderson said. "A lot of times (elected officials) take a walk on these races."

Honigman said he endorsed Anderson because of "my personal high regard for Pat, just based on friendship. He's a nice guy."

Riedlinger, 38, was the 18th District chair for two years and the vice chair for two years before that under Joe Knollenberg, now the 11th District's congressman

in Washington, D.C. (The 18th District was eliminated when congressional districts were redrawn last year.)

Knollenberg isn't taking sides in this race, however. "I think it's best that we let them work it out," he said, adding that Riedlinger and Anderson both supported and helped him in the primary against Honigman and ex-Judge Alice Gilbert last year.

Riedlinger said she has not asked for endorsements because "I don't think it's the place to do it. I think it creates controversy that's unnecessary."

Anderson, Riedlinger said, "should have got some other experience (in holding party office) before he tried this."
