
Crash!



Injury accident: Both drivers suffered injuries in a crash involving a tractor trailer and an automobile on Grand River and Shiawassee Friday afternoon. Fred Kerr of Farmington Hills, the driver of the tractor trailer, suffered head and shoulder injuries after being hurled through the windshield. He was treated at Botsford Hospital and released. Steve Petrucci of Farmington, the driver of the 1990 Mercury, suffered head and hip injuries. Neither driver was wearing a seatbelt. Farmington Public Safety officers said the accident occurred after noon when the automobile, traveling west on Grand River, hit the rear wheels of the tractor trailer going east.

The cost of leasing the space and running the senior adult programs comes out of money raised by a special eight-year tax of .5

mill. That program began in 1991.
Although council members were unanimous in their support of the lease, they and city officials are looking at other options down the road, including buying land and building a new senior center.
"That gives the city 36 months (until July 1995) to pursue the option of a permanent facility," said councilman Torry Sever.
Councilman Aldo Vegnogri said he would have been more comfortable with locking into a

six-year lease instead of having to scramble for space again in two

years.
"I would have liked to nail" down that facility for another six years so that we would have some sort of protection for cur seniors, "Vegnozzi said.

Brock said the city could pursue several options, including a new facility or even buying part or all of an existing facility, such as the Mercy Center, to obtain "dedicated space" for the programs.
