Clarencoville High parents will hear Wednesday how important the Michigan Education Assessment Program (MEAP) exams have become to their children's future.

An invitation to attend a meeting at 7:30 p.m. into school library accompanied the scores their child got on the 1992-93 MEAP test.

"We'll have information on when we'll provide tutoring and the retesting dates we have established," said Clarenceville principal David Simowski.

All Clarenceville schools are now working under an order from Superintendent David Kamish to boost test scores.



Principals of the district's four schools gave re-ports Thursday on what's been done so far in their schools. Clarenceville includes northwest Livonia, northeast Redford, and southeast Farmington

northeast Redford, and southeast Farmington Hills.

"We've brainstormed strategies and wo're analyzingur weaknesses," said Grandview Elementary principal Ellen Davis. "The teachers are somewhat concerned (about Kamish's order) but are willing to work toward correcting the situation. We've had to deal with some bad publicity."

The Clarenceville Board of Education recently called the 1992-93 scores "unacceptable" and told administrators to make improving the scores a "high priority."
