Cartoon Network heads for the classroom

Kids who find studying a foreign
language dull may be in for a surprise
in Spanish class in the coming weeks.

Turner Educational Services, Inc., a branch of the same company that launched the Cartoon Network last October, has purmered with Cable in the Classroom, an educational consortium, to bring laughter to language class. Since the network's launch, Cartoon Network engineers have been dubbing Turner's vast cartoon archive, includes the Hanna-Barbera library, into Spanish for use as a teach

ing tool, according to Joshua Katz, Cartoon's vice president of marketing.

"About 95 percent of the Hanna-

Barbera product already had a second Spanish audio program, "Katz notes, "And now about 55 percent of all our other product has Spanish translation

*One cartoon a week will be running that teachers are allowed to tape," Katz explains. Airing in the wee hours each Friday morning, the selected cartoons differ from the network's regular feeds in that the primary audio is in Spanish. Special study guides are also available

to participating schools.

Animation in education appears very promising, Katz says, and the "fun, involving manner" in which Yogi Bear, George Jetson and friends teach Spanish is already being tested for use in history, art and science classes.
