Despite losing 15-5, 16-9 to state-ranked Durton-Atherton in Saturday's Class C regional semifinals at Almont, Livonia Clarenceville coach Allisha Love had no regrets.

"We played a good team today," Love said. "The scores don't indicate how well we played. This was the best my team has played all year and I don't feel ashamed at all."

The Trojans, who finish the season 27-12-6 overall, led 6-0 in the first game, but the Wolverines scored 15 unanswered points. Clarenceville also led 4-0 in the second game before Atherton took control of the match.

"We got stuck in a rotation and they took advantage of it," Love said. "They have a real good and smart setter who kept us off balance and did a good job controlling the play."

# Pawlewicz star of meet

Karl Pawlewicz of Farmington Hills set records in four events recently at the state championships at Saginaw Valley State University.

He won the 60-yard freestyle (23.12), 200 individual medley (2:08.56), 50 breaststroke (2:03.34) and the 100 individual medley (59.56). He also finished first in the 100 and 200 freestyle and second in the 100 breaststroke.

Pawlewicz posted national top-16 times in all seven events and was the high-point swimmer for the 11-12 boys, helping the Stingrays earn a third-place team finish.

He combined with teammates Tim Muir, Kirk Moudros and Dan Gabriel for a first place in the 200 medley relay, also with a state meet record and national qualifying time.

Other 11-12 boys finishing in the top eight were Muir: 50 freestyle (eighth), 50 butterfly (eighth) and 100 freestyle (third); Gabriel: 50 breaststroke (fifth), 100 backstroke (eighth); and Moudros: 500 freestyle (eighth), 200 freestyle (ninth) and 100 IM (eighth).

The 9-10 boys were led by Jonathan Schwartz, who placed in the 50 freestyle (eighth), 100 butterfly (third), 50 breaststroke (fifth) and 50 butterfly (sixth).

Eric Stricker finished sixth in the 100 breaststroke, eighth in the 50 breaststroke and ninth in the 100 backstroke. Michael Marshall placed between 12th and 16th in five events.

In the freestyle relay, the A and B teams were finalists with the team of Marshall, Brady, Schwartz and Hakeem, finishing sixth. Gundlach, Gabriel, Stricker and Pricc seventh.

Competing in her first 12-and-under championship meet, 9-year-old Hannah Pawlewicz was the high-point runner-up in the 9-10 girls division.

She finished first in the 50 freestyle with a national top-16 time of 27.47, first in the 50 butterfly and 100 freestyle, second in the 100 butterfly and 100 IM. She also placed sixth in the 200 IM and ninth in the 100 backstroke.

The team of Pawlewicz, Elizabeth MacDonald, Lindsey Fetters and Arianna Stella took second in the 200 medley relay, and MacDonald, Stella, Pawlewicz and Rebecca Goodman took second in the 200 freestyle relay.

Fetters swam personal bests in the 200 IM (seventh), 100 IM (eighth), 100 breaststroke (third), 100 butterfly (seventh), 50 breaststroke (third) and 200 freestyle (seventh).

MacDonald was eighth in the 200 freestyle and 100 butterfly. Stella and Goodman were among the top 10 in three events: Mashon Moore and Lauren Turner one each.

The Stingrays are coached by Jeff Cooper, who is assisted by Dave Mack, Laurie Hubbard, Adam Cooper and Danny Knipper. The Stingrays begin spring practices Monday, April 19. Anyone interested in joining the team should call 476-8133 or 647-1308.
