Experts say to take shelter immediately when a tornado warning is in effect.

At home: In the basement under something sturdy, like a

bench. If there is no basement, a small room in the middle of the house (a closet or bathroom) is best. Always stay away from outside wells and windows.

"At work or school: Designated shelter areas are best. Stay away from large, open rooms like auditoriums and gymnasiums, and rooms with windows. Lie low with hands covering the back of your head to reduce neck injuries.

In shopping malls: Go to a designated shelter area or to the center of the building on a low lovel. Stay away from large, open rooms and windows. Never seek shalter in cars in the parking lot. "It is in mobile homes or cars: Leave the vehicle.






