**Tornado siren test set for April**

Oakland County will test the Tornado Siren Warning System at 1 p.m. Thursday, April 1, as part of Michigan Tornado Safety Week March 28-April 3. As an outdoor warning system, the steady three-minute siren tone means a funnel cloud has been sighted and a tornado warning is in effect. Saturday's 1 p.m. siren will only be a test.

If there is no basement, small room in the middle of the house (a closet or bathroom) is best. Always stay away from outside walls and windows. At work or school: Designated shelter areas are best. Stay away from large, open rooms like auditoriums and gymnasiums, and rooms with windows. Lie low with hands covering the back of your head to reduce neck injuries. In shopping malls: Go to a designated shelter area or to the center of the building on a low level. Stay away from large, open rooms and windows. Never seek shelter in cars in the parking lot. In mobile homes or cars: Leave the vehicle.

The system is part of the Early Weather Warning Program. The program's goal is to reduce personal injuries and property damage. The program is a cooperative venture between the National Weather Service and the Oakland County Division of EMS and Emergency Management. Experts say to take shelter immediately when a tornado warning is in effect. At home: In the basement under something sturdy, like a
