Mrs. Costa, 63, of Livonia died

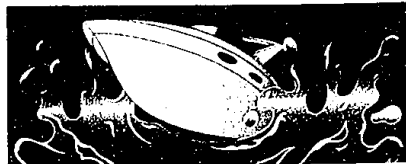
March 26.

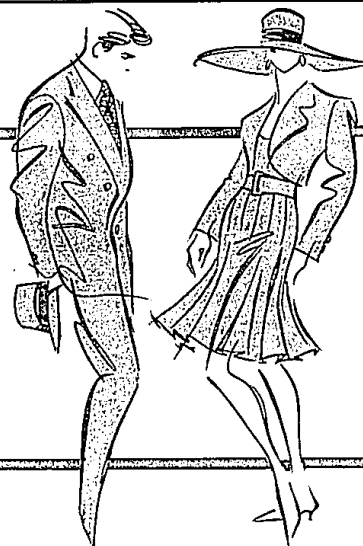
