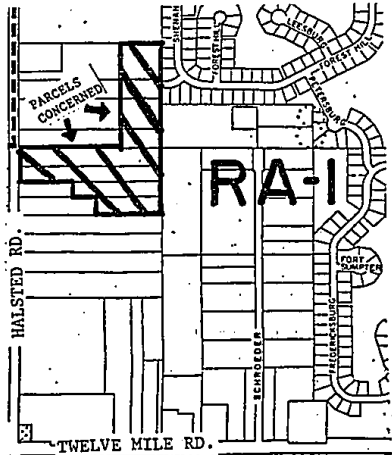
ITEM: Cluster Site Plan/Open Space Plan 57-2-93
