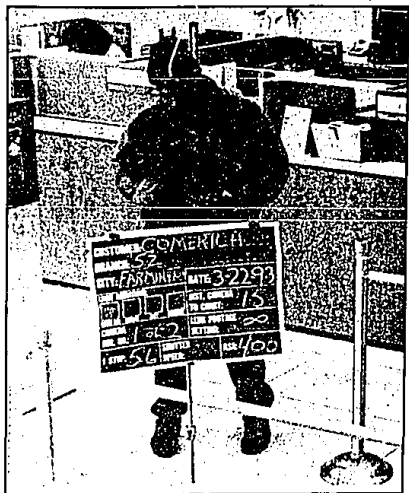


Robbery suspect



Not just testing: A man wanted in connection with the robbery of the Comerica Bank on Grand River and Middlebelt on March 22 at about 2:50 p.m. happened to be on camera as it was being tested. Bank officials originally thought that the robbery took place while the cameras were down. Police are seeking the same man in connection with a bank robbery in Redford on March 26, and several others in the area. Anyone with information should call the Farmington Hills Police at 473-9666.

Beating suspects charged as juveniles

Two 15-year-old girls from Farmington Hills will be tried as juveniles on charges that they beat and robbed a 16-year-old on March 4 at a Cadillac Street residence.

The girls, both Farmington High students, face charges of doing great bodily harm less than murder. One of the girls is also charged with robbing the victim of jewelry worth \$600.

Okland County prosecutors had considered charging the pair as adults. The 16-year-old, who they allegedly beat and robbed, suffered severe head, neck and rib injuries.

The two girls will be face a pre-trial examination, before referee Martin Alvin in Oakland County Probate Court on June 7.

POLICE/FIRE CALLS

Listed below are some of the Farmington area police incidents, fire calls and court cases reported during the past week.

■ BREAK-INS
CDs worth \$120, school books worth \$90, and \$50 in cash were stolen from a 1991 Ford Escort GT parked at the Hunters Square shopping center on Orchard Lake at 14 Mile in Farmington Hills April 2. The passenger window was smashed, causing \$300 in damage.

■ VANDALISM
Two Firestone tires on a 1991 Toyota Corolla parked on Bedford Drive in Farmington Hills were slashed between April 2-3, causing \$165 in damage.

The left rear door of a red 1991 Chevy Corsica parked at TJ Maxx on Orchard Lake was kicked in between April 3-4, causing \$200 in damage.

French doors worth \$300-\$400 were stolen from a residence on Orchard Lake in Farmington

Hills between March 31 and April 5. A breezeway to the house was destroyed in the process, causing \$5,300 in damage.

■ AUTO THEFTS
A 1986 gray and blue Dodge Ram van worth \$10,000 was stolen from the Green Hill Apartments on Green Hill in Farmington Hills between April 1-2. A wallet was stolen from a 1986 maroon Olds Delta 88 at the same location at the same time.

An attempted theft of a 1984 Mazda SE-5 at S-G Import Car Parts on Eight Mile in Farmington Hills between April 3-5 caused \$100 damage to the steering column and the driver's side door.

A 1992 white Ford Mustang valued at \$15,000 was stolen from a residence on Jefferson Court in

Farmington Hills between April 4-5. The car was found by Washtenaw County Sheriff's deputies on Huron River Drive in Ann Arbor April 5. The wheels, seats, hood and other parts had been stolen and the steering column had been punched.

A 1993 Chevy Blazer valued at \$21,000 was stolen from the Builders' Association on Northwestern Highway in Farmington Hills between April 2-4 and found by Detroit police. There was no estimate of damages.

A check of \$216.32 to pay for a load of dirt from the Mid Five Apartments on 13 Mile in Farmington Hills written Dec. 2, 1992, came back because of a closed account.
