a year." Woolf hit only .213 but walked 23 times and scored 14 runs, and he made just three errors — an amazing statistic for a shortstop, Herrington said.

Goff batted .313 with five hits in 16 chances, Smith and Cardoni .250. Smith, who has a football scholarship to Hillsdale College, had five stolen bases and Herrington hopes to increase that number.

"If he gets on base, he can steal; he has the best speed on the team," Herrington said.

Hensel was probably the outstanding player on the JV team and hit .400, according to Herrington.

"He has an excellent glove and good speed," he said. "We look for him to be a very good ballplayer. (Pesci) showed some power on the

JV. He had a couple home runs and hit around .300. He has a strong arm from the outfield."

The Hawks are scheduled to begin the season Thursday, April 22, at Walled Lake Central.

"We should have a winning season," Herrington said. "I think the league will be pretty balanced, so it should be a good year. We've got a good bunch of kids and we should be sound defensively, so we'll see what happens."

CC has potent lineup

Redford Catholic Central held the state's No. 1 ranking until Westland John Glenn bumped the Shamrocks out in the Class A regional tournament at Temperance-Bedford, 6-5.

CC lost several key players from a year ago, including do-it-all pitcher/fielder Scott Kopla, a

hard-throwing right-hander now at Eastern Michigan University. Kopla, who came on in relief last week to beat Michigan, will be missed along with first-team All-Area pick Dan Guseff and second-teamer Paul Kuhn.

Pitching is a question mark, but 6-5 senior right-hander Brian Pakul could emerge as the ace of the staff along with Dave Sunalla.

The two combined for an 8-1 record last season.

"We have some good arms, so we just lack experience," said CC coach John Salter, who has one state title to his credit.

CC will have its power sticks in the lineup too with EMU signee Brian Hicks, the catcher, returning after clubbing nine homers a year ago. Aaron Babicz, an all-state football lineman, also provides power at first base.
