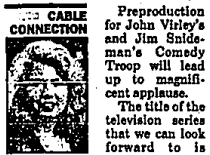


Comedy team goes for laughs on public access

Preproduction for John Virley's and Jim Snideman's Comedy Troop will lead up to magnificent applause. The title of the television series that we can look forward to is "Twisted Shorts - All Night Laundry."

The first part of the process has been developing auditions for comedians, writers and musicians. John emphasizes that there is a tremendous amount of talent in the metropolitan Detroit area - you don't have to go to New York or Los Angeles to find it.

The selection process is prioritized to find those whose talents best relate to one another as characters. The selection does not mean that any one is less talented than the other.

The final result will remind some of the old vaudeville acts or "Saturday Night Live." However, the producers emphasize that they have their own unusual mix.

Musicians will create original music that will be heard throughout the show, and yet there will be some old familiar standards also. Auditions and practices have been taking place at the studio at Southwestern Oakland Cable Commission. However, most of the closed rehearsals this spring will take place at the Novi Civic Center.

The taping process will mostly be done in remote settings. The schedule will be determined by the skit - not by taping an entire show. The introduction is going to be taped at a local coin laundry. Once several programs have been completed, we look forward to seeing them broadcast on Channel 12. We are looking forward to the laughter and the applause - produced by John Virley and Jim Snideman.

That the City Council of the City of Farmington Hills, Oakland County, Michigan, has tentatively declared its intention to make the following improvement: Construction of ROAD IMPROVEMENTS to be located in the City as follows:

That the City Council will meet in the City Hall Council Chambers, 31555 Eleven Mile Road, Farmington Hills, Michigan, on the 19th day of April, 1993, at 7:30 o'clock P.M., Eastern Daylight Time, to hear and consider any objections to the said improvement.
If the City Council approves the making of the improvements, a special assessment may be levied against properties that benefit from the improvements. All 184 of the Public Act of Michigan, 1973, as amended, provides that the special assessment must be protested at the hearing held for the purpose of confirming the special assessment roll before the Michigan Tax Tribunal may acquire jurisdiction of any dispute involving the special assessment. The hearing for the purpose of confirming the special assessment roll will be held, if at all, at a time in the future pursuant to notice given as required by law. Appearance and protest at such hearing is required in order to appeal the amount of the special assessment to the Michigan Tax Tribunal. As a result of a party in interest in property to be assessed, or his or her agent, may appear in person to protest the special assessment, or may protest the special assessment by letter filed with the City Clerk at or prior to the time of the hearing, in which case appearance in person is not required.
