

State art displayed

Art in a variety of dimensions can be found in the 12th annual Michigan Fine Arts Competition, exhibited through May 8 at the Birmingham Bloomfield Art Association, 1616 B. Cranbrook Road in Birmingham.

Artists whose works are in the show live and work in Michigan. Among the Oakland County communities represented are Birmingham, Beverly Hills, West Bloomfield, Troy, Rochester Hills, Rochester, Pontiac and Royal Oak. A reception for artists and guests will take place 2-5 p.m. Saturday, and an awards presentation 3:30 p.m. that day.

This year's juror was Laura Trippi, curator of the New Museum of Contemporary Art in New York City. Many of the entries are installations, featuring such objects as pine needles, a door, a latex glove and a bassinet.

Best of show (\$2,000) went to Paula Stebbins Becker of Bloomfield Hills for "Flight." Becker's work features a black and white photograph of people near an old plane, and a gray, black and white cotton weaving underneath. The texture and color of the cloth resembles a gray plane, the pattern on it suggesting movement or flaps on a plane.

Second prize (\$750) went to Lidia Sacharyn of East Lansing for a work that reaches to the sky in another way. Sacharyn's "Column of Culture" is an orderly tower of books that almost touches the ceiling.

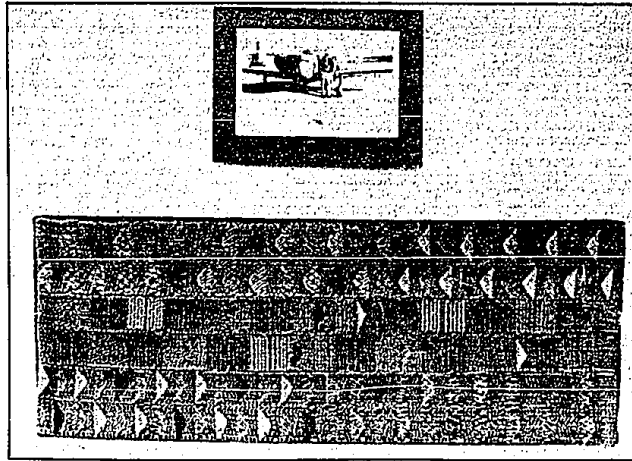
Third prize (\$500) was awarded to Jay Constantine of Grand Rap-

ids for his painting and mixed media work "Rustle Culture (1)." The featured images include overpasses, parts of a shredded tire and a series of small photos showing a nude figure and a cement block.

A juror's award of \$350 went to Suzanne Lentz of Bloomfield Hills for "Burial Hood," a mixed media garment suspended from the ceiling. Mary E. Giehl of Lansing and Joseph Bernard won juror's awards of \$100 each for "Three Cement Bears" and "Remote Duet," respectively. Giehl's entry includes cement and wax bears seated on folding chairs. Bernard's work is acrylic and collage on a wood panel.

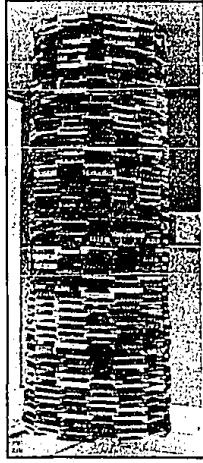
Juror's awards of \$50 each went to Ed Fraga of Detroit for "Chivas Par Vides," mixed media; Russell Forrest Etter of Grosse Pointe Woods for "Shoot," collage; Rick Boerhorst of Grand Rapids for "Self Portrait as Gardener," oil painting; and Amy Sharp of Grand Rapids for "Ode to Cat," black and white photography.
