Lawmakers back Daughters Day

Some Michigan women lawmakers are urging their colleagues to bring their daughters and other female relatives, students and finents, to the state Capitol Wednesday, April 29, in observance of the nationwids "Take Our Daughters to Work Day," announced state Rep. Jan Dolan, R-Farmlogton Hills. "This may be the so-called ingistened '90's, but girls still get contradictory and negative measures about their lives, their future and their self-images," Dolan said.

"This event was conceived to show young women that they merit attention, that adults are interested in their opinions and participation, and that they are important enough to be given a "personalized" tour of the working world."

personanted tout of the owner ing world." Originally planned only for New York, the observance quickly took on nationwide interest after it was publicized. It was orga-nized in Michigan at the legisla-tive level by a bipartisan coalition of women lawmakers.






