

"Citizens of Michigan and all outdoor enthusiasts are big winners today," said Geake, R. Northville, after the Senate unan-imously concurred in House

amendments.

The plan is to turn idle rail corridors into recreational facilities.
Under a package of bills, the Department of Natural Resources will work with local units to develop multi-use trailways for bicycling, hiking and equestrian uses.

Geake's bill will:


