Miss Schneider, 79, died in Venlee, Fla., Monday, April 12, two days before her 80th blithday. A longtime Farmington Hills resident, she was an executive secretary at Detroit Edison, where she worked for 41 years before retiring in the late 1970s.

"She was fun in every way," said her brother, Robert Schneider of Livonia. "You never saw her sad. Everything was elways good. And she loved the Tigers."

Walter Clietr, retired chairman of Detroit Edison, got to know Miss Schneider in the days when secretaries at Edison were forced to quit if they married.

"Miss Schneider was a highly capable person," he said. "She could be trusted to do mythings. She served as secretary to the foremost engineer in the company, and he though highly of her as a person and employee. She was a tradition in the company and a very fine woman. I am sorry to hear of her death."

Kenneth Hartwell, retired director of purchases for Edison, met Miss Schneider in 1939, "way back when I first started at the company, She lived north of me on Dexter Boulevard. We rode together many days on the bus. It was a double-decker, and we'd ride on the top down to 2000 Second Avenue. We really loved that girl. She was great. I'm sad to hear about her death.

"I knew all of the engineers an officers she worked with and how highly they all regarded her,"

Hartwell added. "She worked for (vice president) George Brown, and he thought so much of her." Miss Schneider's elster Mary Jane Petoskey of White Lake said that when her sister retired, "she had the best retirement part anyone ever had at the Edison Boat Ciub. They served brunch and 'moose milk' that my brother Bob made, and she hired a three-pleec Dixideland band. It was just a great party. They gave her a uice gift, but there were no speeches at all — at her request."
