# Women warned about obscene caller The Farmington Public Safety

Department is warning women about a man who has made hun-dreds of obscene phone calls to homes in Metro Detroit.

According to Farmington Pub-Safety commander Charles According to Farmington Fun-jic Safety commander Charles Lee, the caller seeks out fomales who are home alone. He often asks to speak with the husband in the home or will ask for the hus-

band by name.

If he's told that the man is not home, he usually starts a conversation with the female. Once he's gained sufficient information, he will begin his obscene sexually oriented comments and ques-

oriented communications.

The caller tells victims not to hang up, threatening to come to the home and kill them.

"To our knowledge, the caller

has never retaliated against some-one who hung up on him," Lee

However, Lee said people should hang up immediately if the call is not legitimate and call the police. Also, they shouldn't divulge anything of a personal nature to the caller.
The caller has never been positively identified by police as he rarely calls the same home twice.


