

**POLICE/FIRE CALLS**

Listed below are some of the Farmington area police incidents, fire calls and court cases reported during the past week.

**FOUND PROPERTY**

The staff at St. Alexander's Rectory on Shawassaw in Farmington Hills received an unusual donation. An older couple donated some items to the church April 19, including a black plastic suitcase. The staff tried to open the suitcase April 16 and found six handguns. The serial numbers did not identify them as missing or as belonging to anyone. Police are investigating.

**BREAK-INS**

The passenger side front window of a brown Chevy Blazer parked on Flanders in Farmington Hills was smashed between

April 12-13 causing \$200 in damage and an Alpine Stereo system worth \$300 was stolen.

A lap-top computer worth \$2,600 from a 1992 white Chrysler Lebaron parked on Lyncastle between April 14-15. The car's convertible top was ripped causing \$300 in damage.

A Linnear amplifier worth \$400 was stolen from a blue 1991 GMC Jimmy parked at the Metrobank on Grand River in Farmington Hills April 15. The driver's side door lock was punched causing \$500 in damage.

Two doors were kicked in at a residence on Karen Court in Farmington Hills April 15 causing \$300 in damage. A VCR worth \$500 and a portable telephone worth \$150 were stolen.

**LARCENY BY CONVERSION?**

An order for printed T-shirts

from a Farmington Hills sporting goods dealer was never delivered, and the owner of a plumbing wholesaler who ordered the 1,500 T-shirts in July and paid \$2,800. The check cleared but the goods never came. Police are investigating.

**EMBEZZLEMENT**

A Farmington Hills man told police he had \$4,200 in his safety deposit box at a bank in town when he checked on April 6 and it was missing when he checked again on April 14. The bank had no record of the box being opened. The man and his wife have the only keys (which can not be duplicated) and one of their keys must be used to open the box.

**THEFTS**

A lock was removed from a

locker at the YMCA on Farmington in Farmington Hills April 13 and a wallet and watch worth \$350 were stolen.

Items worth \$455, including \$200 in cash, were stolen from a desk at the Alexander Hamilton Insurance facility on 12 Mile in Farmington Hills April 13.

A diamond ring worth about \$1,200 was stolen from a bedroom at a residence on Amber Drive in Farmington Hills April 9.

An RCA, wall-mounted, 19 inch color TV worth \$400 was stolen from a room at the Grand Tuland Motel on Grand River in Farmington Hills April 16.

An RCA VCR worth \$40 and a duffel bag worth \$30 were stolen from a residence on Heartside in Farmington Hills April 15.

A softcase side brief worth \$70, a Franklin planner worth \$50 and \$180 in cash were reported stolen from vehicle parked in a lot at Racquetball Courts in Farmington April 12. Access was gained through a rear window.

Two 65-gallon drums containing grease were taken from the Stank Factory in Farmington April 12. The drums and grease, which is recycled, is worth \$30. Similar incidents have been reported in the area.

A manager at Drakeshire Apartments in Farmington reported \$75 in cash taken from an office desk between April 12-13. There was no sign of forced entry.

An 18-year-old Farmington Hills woman was arrested after a police chase of the 1990 Toyota Corolla she was driving. An officer clocked the car at 63 mph in a 45 mph speed zone on eastbound Nine Mile at Hamilton. The woman drove through a subdivision on Broadwell and turned south on Inkster, passed two cars and was clocked at 80 mph. After

turning right on Eight Mile, she was cut off while trying to turn around at a crossover on westbound Grand River at Jefferson.

**Women warned about obscene caller**

The Farmington Public Safety Department is warning women about a man who has made hundreds of obscene phone calls to homes in Metro Detroit.

According to Farmington Public Safety commander Charles Lee, the caller seeks out females who are home alone. He often asks to speak with the husband in the home or will ask for the husband by name.

If he's told that the man is not home, he usually starts a conversation with the female. Once he's gained sufficient information, he will begin his obscene sexually oriented comments and questions.

The caller tells victims not to hang up, threatening to come to the home and kill them. "To our knowledge, the caller

has never retaliated against someone who hung up on him," Lee said.

However, Lee said people should hang up immediately if the call is not legitimate and call the police. Also, they shouldn't divulge anything of a personal nature to the caller.

The caller has never been positively identified by police as he rarely calls the same home twice.
