

# Cislo's arm lifts Harrison to baseball victory

Farmington Hills Harrison pitcher Jeff Cislo scattered seven hits Monday and got enough support to defeat host Wallo Lake Western 5-1 in a Western Lakes Activities Association baseball game.

The win raised Harrison's record to 3-1 overall. Western fell to 4-5. Cislo struck out four and walked three, and the run allowed was unearned.

The Hawks managed only six hits off losing pitcher Steve Bigman, but they benefited from three Western errors. Harrison scored two runs in the first inning and added three in the fifth to give Cislo a 5-0 lead.

Cislo helped his cause with a two-run double in the fifth, Jack Doline delivered a two-run single in the first.

The Hawks on Saturday swept a doubleheader from visiting North Farmington, 5-4 and 9-5.

Keye Smith was the winning pitcher in Game 1, allowing five hits and striking out 10 in going the distance. Harrison scored twice in the sixth inning to go ahead for good.

Mark Cantor's double scored Matt Woolf from second base with the winning run. Woolf,

Dave Hensel and Brock Goff led Harrison with two hits. Joey Danielewicz led North with three hits and one RBI.

Hensel had two hits, an RBI and scored three times to help make Joe Pesci a winner in Game 2. Pesci allowed two hits in four innings.

Woolf contributed an RBI, scored three times and stole two bases for the Hawks.

**STEVEN 2, FARMING. 0.** Pitcher J.J. Rarog held on for the shutout victory Monday as Livonia Stevenson (2-3) turned back the visiting Falcons (3-8) in the WLLA Lakes Division encounter.

Rarog (1-1) allowed just four hits, a walk and a hit-batman to gain the victory. He struck out four.

Third baseman Bob Drummond made an unassisted double play to end the game after a Farmington squeeze play went awry.

Brad Morgan and Chris Koenigman each collected two hits for the Spartans. Morgan scored twice, including a steal of home in the third inning.

Mike Williams and Jeff Drummond each had two hits for Farmington.

Ron Salomonson was the losing pitcher.

**CIVILLE 7, N'WEST 6.** Mark Juncal tossed a five-hitter Monday, but needed relief help from Carl Holston in the top of the seventh as Livonia Clarenceville (3-2 overall) remained unbeaten in the West Conference with a victory over visiting Rochester Hills Lutheran Northwest.

Williams had an RBI single and Salomonson drove in Brian Dudinski from second base with a double in the second. Farmington's other two runs came on a dropped flyball.

The Falcons managed only three hits in the nightcap. Farmington's lone run came in the first when Salomonson was safe on an error, stole second base and scored on Williams' single.

On Saturday, host Novi swept a twin bill from the Trojans, 11-0 and 9-7. Clarenceville couldn't hold a 7-0 lead in the nightcap as Holston was greeted by a three-run homer in the fourth to put the Wildcats on top 8-7.

Freshman Rob Ashton, roughed for nine runs on four hits and eight walks, was the losing pitcher in the opener (five-inning mercy rule).

Holston came on to get the final out with the bases loaded in the seventh. The senior ended the game on a groundout. Juncal scattered seven hits and walked seven for Clarenceville, now 3-0 in the Metro.

Mark Skrepla belted a three-run homer in the second inning, while Chris Fryer contributed a two-run single in the first. Holston's double scored Scott Calina in the sixth to give the Trojans a 7-4 lead.

#### PROPOSAL A

A PROPOSAL TO LIMIT ANNUAL INCREASES IN ALL PROPERTY TAX ASSESSMENT, REDUCE MAXIMUM SCHOOL OPERATING TAXES, INCREASE THE STATE SALES AND USE TAX RATES FROM 4% TO 6%, CONSTITUTIONALLY DEDICATE FUNDS FOR LOCAL SCHOOLS AND SET A PER-PUPIL FUNDING GUARANTEE

The proposed constitutional amendment would:

- 1) Limit for each property parcel (excluding new construction) annual assessment increase to 5% or the inflation rate, whichever is less. When property is sold or transferred, adjust assessment according to current market value.
- 2) Reduce maximum school operating taxes to 18 non-voted mills. Permit districts to levy up to 8 additional voted mills.
- 3) Reduce 50-mill maximum property tax limit to 40 mills.
- 4) Increase state sales and use tax rates to 6%. Dedicate this additional revenue and lottery proceeds to schools.
- 5) Establish a minimum state/local per-pupil funding guarantee, annually adjusted for revenue changes. Provide a minimum 3% per-pupil funding increase in 1993-1994.
