Bow Wow

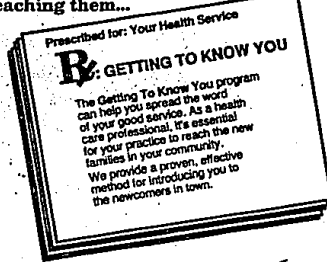
