## O&E finds SMART buses punctual, clean



SMART transportation: Hundreds of people ride the SMART buses in Oakland County every day. On April 22 and 23, SMART had back-to-back days with more than 30,000 riders in southeast Michigan.

Wirgau and SMART were so upheat, The Observer & Eccentric Newspapers decided to accept the invitation.
We put one staff member on the Orchard Lake Route 851 and another on Rochester Road Route 492. Both routes start in the northern suburbs and wind their way south. Route 861 stops at the Cross Winds Mall, the Orchard Lake Mall, the Parmington Hills Campus of Oakland Community College and Northland before continuing to Detroit. Route 492

goes to the Cakland Mall where Detroit-bound riders transfer to Route 495.

#### Check out SMART

The two staffers supposed they had jobs in downtown Detroit, and they had to be there by 9 a.m. They could have returned via the same routes. But the O&E staffers came back on the Pontiac 450 along the Woodward corridor. They caught it in front of the Omni Hotel at 9 a.m., and they took it north along Woodward. They arrived at Woodward and Maple in Birmingham about 9:52 a.m.

Can riders rely on the system? What about cost? What about getting back? What's it like on the SMART buses?
The effort was by no means a scientific study. But neither was it a set-up. There were no advanced notice to the public relations office. The marketing department knew the O&E might be riding SMART, but they didn't know where or when.
The staffers did what any new rider would have to do: decide where they wanted to go and check with SMART on schedu-

ling. Here's what the staffers found last Tuesday when they accepted SMART's invitation and rode the buses to the Renaissance Center.

Buses are punctual — almost too punctual. Riders can be on time, but still miss the buse-locally discovered by the state of the staffers, but if they don't see any, it's off they go.

The buses from the Cross Winds Mail in West Bloomfied and the intersection of Rochester and Hamlin roads in Rochester and of the scheduled departure times, 648 a.m. and 716 a.m., respectively.

As a result of being punctual, the buses arrived at their destinations on time, if not a moment or two ahead of schedule.

That's usually the case, according to Yuchi Chang, 13, who said she rides SMART to Wayne State University twice a week to study English. Chang said she came to the United States earlier this year from Taiwan and lives with an uncle in Rochester Hills.

When asked about SMART's punctuality, at least six other riders and the buses are "usually or "always" on time.
