
Synagogue to host classical concert

Adat Shalom Synagogue in Farmington Hills presents "A Showcase of New American Musicians" at 7:30 p.m. Thursday, May 20, in the synagogue's Main sanctuary, 29901 Middlebelt Road. Featured in the concert will be violinist Mark Komissarov, balalaika virtuoso Gennady Zut, and mezzo-soprano Irina Lekhtman. Komissarov was a Russian violin student from an early age. He was born in Leningrad and studied at the famous Petersburg-Leningrad School. The winner of the prestigious Laureate title at the International G. Weizlawski Competition in Poland, he has combined teaching and performance in his career. Zut was born in the small Siberian city of Tumen and studied the balalaika from the age of 12. Upon graduation from the Musical College of Tumen, his career flourished, as he performed, taught and directed a Russian folk music orchestra. In 1976, Zut began further studies at the Leningrad Conservatory, performing. See CONCERT, 18A

Wolf to help plan college program

Oakland County Commissioner Donn Wolf, R-Farmington Hills, has been appointed to the Lawrence Technological University Advisory Board on Technological Communications. The new Technological Communications undergraduate program, currently in the development stages, will be offered to students by the College of Arts and Science beginning in the fall of 1994. Assistant professor Patricia L. Cornett is director of the program. Advisory board members will assist with advice on course curriculum and program development, serve as liaison to local businesses and help develop a needs assessment for communicators in the technical professions. Cornett said the board is invaluable as a resource for ideas, business contacts and internships. "We are pleased that Commissioner Wolf has agreed to serve the university in this capacity. His background in communications and business will play an important role in our curriculum development and implementation," Cornett said. In addition to Wolf's position on the Oakland County Board of Commissioners, he is a governmental executive for Detroit Edison.
