Senior Don Johnson was Salem's workhorse. He was a member of the Rocks' victorious 400, shuttle hurdle and long jump relay teams. Johnson also went 14.9 to finish third in the 110 highs. Southfield-Lathrup's Maurice Wilson edged Farmington Harrison's Don Bryant to tie a meet record with a time of 14.7.
