Richardson said he participates in the program every year.

Richardson sees it as a way of recruiting future veterinarians. "Maybe we'll encourage them; maybe we'll discourage them," Richardson said. "... We're

trying to get the top people in veterinary medicine."

McConaghe said anywhere from 400 to 500 students sign up. Names are drawn from a hat. This year, students selected had to make the contact with the

person they wanted to shadow.

"We're looking at it from an educational standpoint," McConaghe said, "in order for them to see how much education they may need for a certain career, or just to think about the future."
