Harrison coach Mark Babcock said he was not surprised by North's margin of victory, adding the Hawks actually had their best team performance of the year.

"I honestly have to say no, because we knew North was coming and they have a good team," he said. "Of the 16 events, we had 11 season-best performances."

"If we had blown it and not run well, it would have been different, but we have to give (North) a lot of credit."

Boys meet close

The Harrison boys won nine events but were pushed by Farmington, which had six first places and won the last four races, closing the final margin to 76 1/2 to 66.

"We told the kids we expected it to be that close," Harrison coach John Reed said. "They have a great team and they're going to get better as the year goes on."

"Probably, the reason they couldn't beat us is we were a little

better in the sprints. Their distance runners did well. That 3,200 relay time is one of best I've seen in some time."

Harrison's Don Bryant won the high jump and both hurdle races, equalling the meet record in the 100 highs with a 14.76 time. He ran 14.76 later that night at the Observerland Relays and finished second to Southfield-Lathrup's Maurice Wilson. His times made him No. 1 in the area rankings, however.

Justin Dreyer won the 1,600 run at the city meet and repeated the victory in the Observerland Relays later the same day.

"He did what he had to do in the city meet," Reed said, adding the Hawks also pulled some runners from the 200 dash while trying to juggle the city and Observerland meets at the same time.

Gil Chavez won the long jump and was on both winning relays. Starting with Bryant's first in the high hurdles, the Hawks won six

consecutive events in the middle of the meet.

Scott Gurke was first in the 100 dash. Dreyer led the 1,600 run and Matt Zimmerman the 400 dash. Chavez, Ahsan Allos and Jason Granger combined with Marc Ferguson to win the 800 relay and Gurke the 400 relay.

"Our 10-point difference was far better than we anticipated," Farmington coach Dave Catherman said. "Harrison obviously has more depth and is going to be a contender in the conference championships."

"We were led by the distance crew again. Dave Clnard had a tremendous triple. Clnard, Af-

ferbaugh and Tom May — the big three.

"Jason Jackson has arrived. He has turned the middle distances into a real threat and is a real good jumper."

Jackson, May, Afferbaugh and Clnard set a meet and track record (8:09.7) in the 3,200 relay. Sean Hassell replaced Afferbaugh in that foursome on the winning 1,600 relay team.

Clnard also won the 800, Afferbaugh the 3,200, Corey Minous the shot put and Nigel Whitl the 200 dash. North's winners were Mike Poissant (discus) and Keith Yanachik (pole vault).
