# Knollenberg hears opinions

Volcing concerns on a variety of issues — from health care reform to federal budget plans to the abortion debate — scores of local residents turned out Saturday for a town halt-type meeting in the Farmington Hills City Hall with U.S. Rep. Knollenberg addressed a range of issues introduced by those attending the meeting, which he called an "essential and necessary" method of keeping in tout with the people.

"People bave a right to know what is happening, to hear us and talk with us. To have this type of meeting in the best way to get the message across," he said.

Of course, not everyone in the audience aheard Knollenberg's stated views on all issues dis-cussed, as evidenced by the varied response he received from his pro-life stance, for example.

His firm stand against a feder-

His firm stand against a federally controlled medical insurance program, however, drew resounding applause from the audience.

"We have the best medical care in the world, the highest technol-ogy. But rising costs are a prob-lem," said Knollenberg.

He is currently working on a health care plan to present to Congress which calls for strength-ening the free market forces and concentrating on internal reform,

among other measures.

"The (federal) government
can't balance a budget. Don't let
them get into this," he said.
There is pienty of opportunity
within the present system to
"clean up" and "fine tune" what
is already established, he
said. "Let's not amputate the
body to save an arm."
Regarding the federal budget,
Knollenberg elaborated on his
proposed Congressional Resolution 54, which calls for no new
taxes without the balanced budget
amendment, as well as other
aspects of his economic plan
focusing on pro-growth tax cuts,
spending restraints and other
structural reforms.

He was also asked to comment
on the current M-102 road improvement plan for which federal
funds are being sought. Knollenberg said that the situation is one
of priority, with efforts under way
to coordinate with the state trans-

portation department and other groups to deal with the project.


"It is a slow process, but certainly a case can be made. We'll be keeping after It," he said.

Other topics Knollenberg talked about included his support of congressional term limitations, as well as the controversial Brady Bill, which he does not support.

"The Brady Bill is well-intentioned but has no punch to it. I am against it," he said. "If you outlaw guns, outlaws are going to have them."

Plans are in the making to con-tinue these local town hall meet-ings with Knollenberg, as he vows to keep listening to voters.

"I find that if you don't keep up day by day, hour by hour, minute by minute, you can lose your edge. 'b believe in doing my homework, meeting with the people and focusing on specific issues that concern them," he said.


