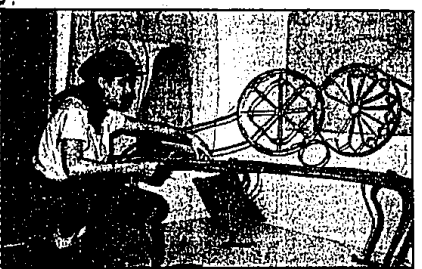

hangs freely from brass rods. Coffer's endtable features a copper medallion in the center. The top is a triangle, the straight line of each side relaxing into flowing lines in the center. Its legs are of dark bubinga wood, its top of birdseye maple wood.

Fairuz Arabo of West Bloomfield, a junior, designed a loveseat and a table. The steel and bronze loveseat has tendrils-like legs, and a back comprised of two large circles, each with a different pattern. The seat is woven with wide strips like a basket.
