Raiders 3rd in league tennis meet

Northville left little doubt last week who's No. 1 in boys tennis for the Western Lakes Activities Association.
The Mustangs won five of eight flights and reached the finals in two others en route to a 27-1 point first-place performance in the 12-team field.
It was Northville's second straight WLAAs crown.
Host Livonia Stevenson, which had visions of overhauling the Mustangs, finished a distant second with 19, while North Farmington took third with 16. See statistical summary.
Northville kept Northville had outstanding singles players, but their doubles teams played better than any of the rest of us thought they would." Stevenson coach George Croll said. "They played very well."
Northville went 11-0 during the dual meet season, while Stevenson suffered only one loss in 11 WLAAs duals, a 5-3 setback to the Mustangs.
"I would say this team rates with last year," Northville coach Dick Norton said. "It's my 17th year and we've had only two unbeaten teams."
With 10 of the top 12 players returning next season, it's a good bet Northville will three-peat.
But No. 1 singles player Mark Schwegle, only one of two players, will be sorely missed. The nationally ranked player graduates next month and will be heading for Michigan State.

"Our singles have been carrying us all year, but our doubles teams really played well," Norton said. "It was a pleasant surprise."
At No. 1, Northville's Eric Alexander and Ryan Moak upped to the top seeds, Matt Gerlach and Justin Loza of Stevenson, in a semifinal match, 6-6, 8-2, 7-6 (8-6).
But North's duo of Jason Wendorf and Brad Martin went on to win the title, 4-6, 6-3, 6-4.
Stevenson came away with titles at Nos. 2 and 5 doubles.
Seniors Mike Miller and Ben Moritz, the top seeds, finished an unbeaten regular season with a 6-4, 3-6, 6-3 win over North's Jeff Spear and Dave Midgal.
At No. 3, another Stevenson senior tandem, Ryan Schmidt and Scott Sibel, the top seeds, also capped an unbeaten campaign with a 6-4, 7-5 triumph against North's Chad Crosby and Rob Kukarinia (the team's other senior) and Matt Telepo.
In somewhat of a surprise at No. 4, doubles, unbeated Richard Bell and Vivek Mohita topped Stevenson's Chad Crosby and Mark Magnusson, 6-4, 6-2.
"They (Northville) deserve a shot at the state meet," Croll said. "They're better than a lot of teams that will make it out of the regional."
Northville needed to beat out either Ann Arbor Pioneer, ranked No. 2 in Class 1, or No. 3 Ann Arbor Huron, over the weekend to qualify for the state Class A tourney.

Shamrocks win regional

Redford Catholic Central and Livonia Stevenson are both headed for the state Class A boys tennis championships, June 4-5 in Midland.
On Friday, CC's Shamrocks, winning three flights and finishing second in two others, captured the Dearborn regional tourney with a team-high 22 points, giving rookie coach Greg Grabowski his first trip to Midland.
Stevenson, meanwhile, edged out Dearborn Edsel Ford for the second place spot, 16-17, advancing for the second straight year and the fourth overall for coach George Croll.
The Spartans won two flights, including Ryan Schmidt and Scott Sibel, and their overall record to 21-0 with a straight set win over Jason Olaszewski and Ranjit Gill of CC.
Stevenson's No. 3 singles player, junior Bill Hensley, also came away victorious with a straight-set win over Edsel Ford's Jerry O'Meara.
At No. 2 doubles, CC's Doug Newton and Phil Tomez handed Stevenson's duo of Ben Moritz and Mike Miller its first loss of the year in 21 matches, 6-4, 7-6.
Other CC winners included Chris Bonn (No. 2 singles), along with Ben Rost and Jeff Heathcock (No. 1 doubles).
CC's Mike Shaya, a junior, reached the finals at No. 1 singles before losing to Edsel's Geoff Jorgensen, 6-4, 7-5.
At No. 4 singles, Stevenson junior Tom Phum was a surprise, reaching the final before losing to Brian Crosby of Dearborn in a three-setter.
