AT LIVONIA MALL

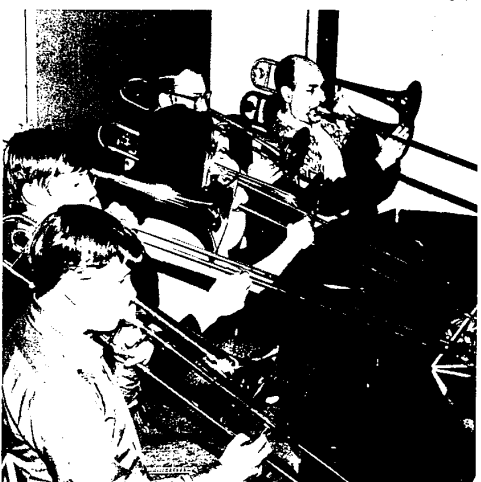

JUNIOR HIGH CONCERTS

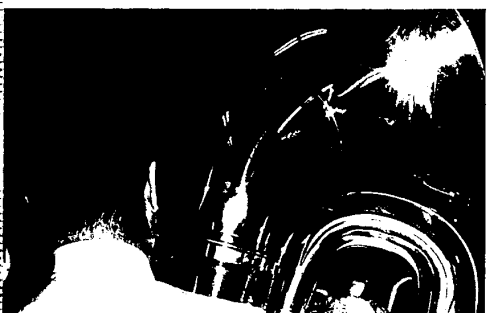
