3 All-A Records At OCC

Three Observerland students graduated with 4.0 (all "A") grade point averages from Oakland Community College last week.

Cynthia Bradley of Farmington, Kathy Kelsner of Livonia, and Doris Hay of Southfield were among the 18 students who graduated with the perfect averages.

A total of 923 students graduated — the largest number of graduates in the history of the three-campus college.

Southfield twins Donald and Ronald Kramer graduated with almost identical grade points of 3.021 and 3.023 respectively.

NAMES OF the rest of the graduates will be reported through the college at a later date.

Noah Brown Jr., vice president of student affairs at Wayne State University, gave the keynote address at the commencement exercises on "the Role of the Community College."

Included in the graduates were 215 students from the federally-funded career opportunity program, which trains the disadvantaged to become teacher aides and teacher assistants.

Dr. William L. Smith, associate commissioner of the Bureau of Educational Personnel Development in Washington, D.C. awarded the 23 associate degrees and the 192 certificates earned in this program.

Dotseth Will Auction For Farmington Artists

FARMINGTON James H. Dotseth, director of applied sciences and arts for Oakland Community College, has agreed to be the auctioneer for the art auction held Sunday, May 2, from 2-5 p.m. by the Farmington Artists Club.

THE ART AUCTION will climax the club's spring exhibit to be held in the Farmington Masonic Temple, Grand River and Farmington Rds., from 10 a.m. to 9 p.m. on April 29, 30, from noon to 9 p.m. on May 1, and noon to 5 p.m. on May 2.

Judge for the Spring Exhibit will be Harry Antis, a North American wildlife artist now working on a collection of paintings called the "Monarch Series" which depicts endangered animal species in this country.

DOTSETH HAS A BS in industrial education from Stout State University in Menomonie, Wis., a master's in vocational education from WSU, and has taken advanced credits at U-M, WSU and MUS.

Dotseth became interested in auctioneering as a youngster when his father's friend, an auctioneer, took

him on many auctioneering trips. He still retains the "lingo" embedded in those early years of listening to the experts.

He was a classroom teacher for 12 years and has also been a truck driver, machinist, and tool and die maker. During WWII, he completed his officer candidacy at Harvard University and served in various personnel departments. He retired from the

Naval Reserve as a commander after 27 years service. Dotseth spent 10 years in the Michigan Department of Public Instruction as a consultant, three years as dean of technical education at Schoolcraft Community College in Livonia, and the past six years with OCC. He is married, has two children, and lives in Orchard Lake.
