For the fee of \$12,000, OCC has reserved the Pelace Friday for its annual graduation ceremony. This fee will be recouped somewhat by the \$25 graduation fee that students must pay.

Usually OCC rents the Pontiac Silverdome for these occasions, but it was booked June 4, said OCC spokesman George Cartsonis, so the college turned to Isiah's House for shelter.

Two thousand of OCC's 30,000 students have applied for degrees, and 1,000 are expected to attend the ceremony. Cartsonis said.
