MICHAEL H. FEILER
Mr. Feiler, 63, of Farmington Hills died May 22 in Botsford Hospital, Farmington Hills. Born in Brooklyn, N.Y., Mr. Feiler was an attorney. He was senior partner of Feiler, Joelson, Lakind, & Rosenberg in Farmington Hills. He was a graduate of Antioch College. He graduated cum laude from Detroit College of Law and U.M. Howard Law School in Cambridge, Mass.
Mr. Feiler was a law clerk to John H. Gillis, Charles Levin and Thomas Kavanagh, State of Michigan Court of Appeals 1966-69; practicing attorney, senior member of the firm 1969-present. From 1969-70 he was State of Michigan Assistant Attorney

General; 1969-1978 he was adjunct professor of law, Detroit College of Law.
Mr. Feiler served as consultant and legal counsel on many problems concerning land use controls. He served as a member of the Local Government Law Section of the American Bar Association and participated in the national convention of the American Society of Planning Officials as a representative of the American Bar Association.
Mr. Feiler was a faculty member at the Institute of Continuing Legal Education in the areas of appellate litigation and zoning strategy and tactics. He also served as legal counsel for a special study of land use controls in western Wayne County under a grant by the Wayne County Commission and is author of the report: Legal Planning Considerations of Growth Management.
