To boldly go where no fan club has gone before

Q: "Star Trek: The Next Generation" is my favorite show, but I can't find any information about a fan club or a catalog where I can purchase memorabilia. Is there one?

A: Star Trek: The Official Fan Club handles all three "Star Trek" series. Annual membership costs \$11.95 and includes a membership kit full of collectibles, a quarterly catalog of memorabilia and merchandise that can be purchased, plus a subscription to "The Official Star Trek Magazine" (published bimonthly). The address is P.O. Box 111000, Aurora, Colo. 80042.

Q: Where did Counselor Troi of "Star Trek: The Next Generation" learn to speak in such a precise manner? Do I detect an accent?

A: Marina Sirtis, who plays Troi on the series, was born in London to Greek parents. However, she disguises her English inflection with an accent she developed for the role. "In the 24th century," she says, "geographic or nationalistic barriers are not so evident. The

Earth as a planet is your country, your nationality. I didn't want anyone to be able to pin down my accent to any particular country, and being good at accents, the producers trusted me to come up with something appropriate."

Q: I just saw "The Dark Half." I was waiting through the whole movie to see Stephen King in a cameo role. I didn't see him, but did I just miss him? And do you have an address where I could write to him?

A: King didn't make a cameo in "The Dark Half." Shirley Sonderegger, his secretary, says, "I recall he had planned to [appear in the movie], but due to his wild and crazy schedule during the filming, it just didn't work out.
