### A&E's 'Brides' looks at the church in turmoil

Oscar-winner Brenda Fricker ("My Left Foot") stars as Sister Agnes, the flinty mistress of novices in "Brides of Christ," a three-part miniseries from Australia airing Sunday through Tuesday, June 13-15, on A&E. The six-hour drama focuses on nuns, novices and students in an Australian convent during the 1960s, a tumultuous period that radically changed the Roman Catholic Church. The radiant Josephine Bynes co-stars as Sister Catherine, a young nun who clashes with her seniors over "medieval hocus-pocus, trying to conjure God out of an equation."

MTV reporter Kurt Loder is the host of "Hate Rock," a startling examination of music linked to a growing global movement of racial hatred and violence, premiering Wednesday, June 16, on the cable music channel. The half-hour special includes interviews with young neo-Nazi skinheads in Germany.

With "Jurassic Park" hitting theaters around the country, TBS has scheduled a full "Day of the Dinosaurs" on Wednesday. Highlights include "The Land That Time Forgot."

"Achieving the American Dream" is the theme of special programming airing all week on CNBC. A special live town meeting from Chicago kicks things off on Monday night.

Jeremy Irons stars in "The Dream," based on a short story by Dostoyevsky, debuting Saturday, June 19, on Bravo.
