

POLICE/FIRE CALLS

Listed below are some of the Farmington area police incidents, fire calls and court cases reported during the past week.

THEFT

Hills cites 5 in booze sale sting

Inexperience in dealing with underage customers trying to buy alcohol seems to be the common denominator for four of five businesses cited for violations by Farmington Hills Police.

The department sent a 19-year-old police cadet into 35 businesses that sell liquor "off premises," such as party stores, drug stores and grocery stores, on June 3.

Five were cited for selling alcohol to the man: The Strawberry Hills Fruit Market, 32906 Middlebelt; The 7-Eleven at 29318 Orchard Lake; Tom's Party Store at 20925 Inkster; Efron Mulwood Drugs, 35584 Grand River; and A & J Drugs, 39281 Grand River.

"Most of them are businesses with new liquor licenses or transferred licenses," said detective Sgt. Chuck Nebus. "They hadn't had any violations."

Efron Mulwood Drugs had been cited for selling to minors twice in 1988 and once in 1989, Nebus said. The state Liquor

Control Commission had cited Efron for three violations within a 24-month period and ordered a two-day suspension of liquor sales at the establishment in 1989, he said.

The "strike" was the 13th by the department of off-premises liquor sale businesses since 1985. Last June, four out of 36 businesses were cited.

"We would hope that this was a result of inexperience by these businesses," Nebus said. "We hope they will take some steps to correct the problem."

The state can fine a business up to \$1,000 for each violation and can suspend or revoke a liquor license for three or more violations within a 24-month period.

Those who sell to minors are charged with a misdemeanor, Nebus said.

Police also sent a cadet to on-premise liquor sales establishments, including restaurants and taverns, in November of 1992. That "strike" turned up 10 violations.

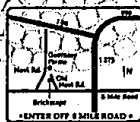
