When Ron Hudak, a wheelchair-bound Farmington Hills resident, needed renovation work done on his home recently, he found that he could count on both the city of Farmington Hills and the Student Painters Co.

City officials Steve Brock and

Rick Lampi assisted Hudak via the housing rehabilitation program, which aids low-income families.

A wall was knocked down to enlarge the kitchen, giving Hudak easier access to his 1,300-square-foot ranch.

Then Jim Ruth of Student Painters volunteered his compa-

ny's labor free of charge. And Sherwin Williams Paint Co. provided the paint.

"They recognized that I needed help," said Hudak, 44, a paraplegic.

In 1971, Hudak, an automotive technician, was in an auto accident en route to classes at Schoolcraft College.

He broke his back and was in a coma for 72 hours.

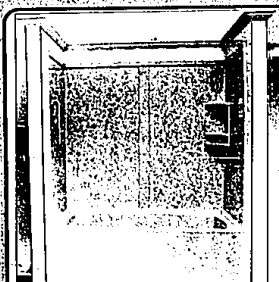
