They have to be fired at a very high temperature so they won't break in the cold weather. White-head finds pots where he can, and sometimes drills holes in the bot-tom to make them suitable for planting. Some of the bases are feshioned from old logs. One had been stripped of its bark and pol-ished until it had a fine warm sheen.
