## Depth and experience

Then there's Farmington grad David Shepherd (6-8, 160), a part-

time starter at midfield and on defense for the Falcons; Dearborn Crestwood's Garrett Binkley (6-8, 150), team captain and top scorer for the past two seasons; Milford Lakeland's Tom Kuzak (6-11, 160), the Eagles' most valuable player who will play midfield and defense; and Northville's Chuck Collins, a small (6-8) but quick and capable keeper.

There are other players Dimitriou is still working on, such as Oxford grad Andy Mathison, a strong all-around player, and Canton keeper Ryan Henkel (6-2, 180).

Everything considered, it seems SC should at least match last

year's 12-2-1 finish. The question is, can the Owls surpass it? Can they reach the NJCAA Tournament, a goal which, even though SC has dominated the region since Dimitriou took over a decade ago, has generally evaded them (just one appearance)?

This team will have much more experience (only three players had played JC experience last season) and at least an equal amount of talent. "With the players we have coming back — I don't see another team with that kind of nucleus," said Dimitriou. "Plus with the influx of new players, I think we'll be in a good position to defend our title."

Make that a very good position.

years, but this one had that winning attitude, especially with Call. He inspired people."

Call had three hits in the championship game, Murray and Bowen two each.

Murray was the team's leading hitter with a .525 average and 22 RBI. Call hit .475, Archambeau .423 and Bowen .405.

Call led Sorrows with 18 stolen bases and had 14 RBI. Archambeau scored a team-high 23 runs and Zebaur 22. Murray also was 7-0 as a pitcher and Call 4-0.

In the playoffs, Sorrows defeated St. Cyrion 5-4, St. Frances Ca-

brini 3-1 and Our Lady of Victory 5-0 in the semifinal game.

The Saints were 9-1 and champions of their CVO division, which included Livonia St. Michael, Plymouth Our Lady of Good Counsel, Garden City St. Raphael (the only team to defeat Sorrows), Divine Child and Westland St. Richard.

The Saints had lost to St. Joan in the CVO championship game last year, 7-4. But they had beaten the East Side school in the final of the Sorrows preseason tournament the last two years, 6-4 each time.
