Forko begins to soar on NBC's 'Wings'

One of the reasons the NBC comedy series "Wings" is still flying high is the addition of Farrah Forko as a cast regular. Forko plays helicopter pilot Alex Lambert, whose structural charms and brassy attitude have sent brothers Joe (Tim Daly) and Brian (Steven Weber) into a tailspin.

"I'm sure there are parts of me that are like Alex," says Forko, "and parts of me I wish were more like Alex, but I don't think you can play a character that you don't have anything in common with. She seems much stronger, more focused or confident than I guess I perceive myself to be, but I think I'm learning a lot from her."

A native of Corpus Christi, Texas, Forko began her career on the Dallas stage and in independent films. She admits she was a bit green when she first appeared on "Wings."

"It was my first time to do a sitcom," Forko recalls, "so my first day at work, I walked on the stage, and I saw these bleachers. I said to somebody, 'What are these bleachers for?' And they said, 'Farrah! It's for the audience.' I was shocked and said, 'Oh my God! We do this in front of an audience?!' "

Forko is named for actress Farrah Fawcett, also of Corpus Christi. "I was named after her before she was famous. My parents knew her in high school, and they liked the name. I always thought it was a real pretty name, but of course, people tease me about it now."
