Taking place only a few miles from the Olympic Village, the students pledge that they will disrupt the Games which begin next Saturday.

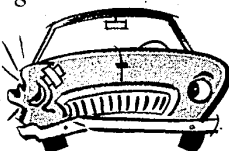

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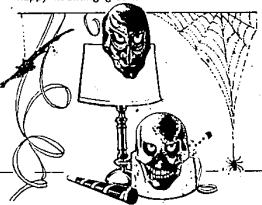
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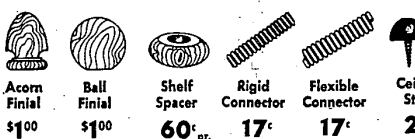
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
